

Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program Statement of Authorization

1. My child has permission to be transported via a GSA Fleet vehicle to participate in Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program activities, camps and related travel.

In case that your child or anyone in the immediate household of the child develops a reportable communicable disease as defined by the State board of Health, IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PARENT TO NOTIFY THE Child & Youth Program within 24 hours or the next business day in order for the program to take proper action, except in the case of life-threatening diseases which must be reported immediately.
5. My signature authorizes the management and staff of the Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program to act for me according to their best judgement in the event of medical emergency and/or routine medical care. I/we grant permission for emergency medical treatment and/or routine medical care by the program staff, camp medic/doctor/nurse, or private physician and/or hospital or emergency health care facility staff, under the same circumstances as above, if needed. Any such action will be taken in the best interest of my child and will be reported to me/us as soon as possible. My signature waives and or releases the Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program from any and all liability and/or financial responsibility for any medical expenses incurred.
6. The parent/guardian authorizes the application of sunscreen for his or her child by Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program Staff and volunteers. NO/DUE TO ALLERGY
7. The parent/guardian authorizes the application of insect repellent for his or her child by Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program Staff and volunteers. NO/DUE TO ALLERGY

IDNG Child & Youth Program Camp Code of Conduct

To ensure that camp is a positive and enjoyable experience for all participants, it is necessary to establish an encourage high standards of behavior. Please read the following information and sign below.

As a youth participant in camp, I will uphold the following conduct and behavior standards:

- I will be courteous and respectful towards others.
- I agree to value and respect other's ideas regardless of whether they are the same as my own.
- I will attend, and actively participate in all sessions and activities.
- I will conduct myself in a positive and appropriate manner at all times.
- I will dress appropriately at all times. I understand that revealing clothing or apparel featuring violence, alcohol, tobacco, and other drug messages is prohibited. *See Dress Code Policy.
- I will be in my room at the prescribed curfew time each night unless scheduled activities extend beyond this time.
- I understand that I can/will forfeit my attendance at camp for any misconduct or repeated misbehavior and be required to leave at the expense of my parent/legal guardian.
- I understand that use of cell phones and other personal electronic devices are not authorized.
- I will not use or possess alcohol, tobacco, other drugs or weapons.
- I will refrain from violence, sexual activity, and damage to property/equipment at any time during camp.

As a participant at camp, I represent not only myself, but my family, service member and the United States Army Child Youth Services program, and I pledge to uphold this commitment. I understand that if I am not able to remain in good standing at camp and uphold the commitments set forth above, I will be asked to leave.

UPDATED Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Camp Dress Code Policy (August 2018)

The Idaho National Guard Child & Youth Program, State Family Programs Director and Child & Youth Program Coordinator team want to ensure that those in attendance at Summer Camp and Snow Bash are able to gain the full experience, support and resources available during these events. Our number one goal during these events is to ensure and promote a safe environment while preventing interference of experience and purpose of camp to all campers and volunteers. We do not intend to dictate the type of clothes to be worn for your youth; **however we do maintain the right and final discretion of appropriate dress during these events.**

The list below identifies and provides an explanation of appropriate dress code during camp. If a camper/volunteer does not adhere to these standards they will be asked to change by camp directors. Extreme cases and disregard of dress code by any attendee, also have the potential of being dismissed from the camp event at the cost/expense of the parent/volunteer.

Please communicate with the Child & Youth Program should you have any questions, concerns or comments regarding this new policy.

Not Authorized

- Shirts- Shirts that have suggestive, double meaning/innuendo, or suggest inappropriate ideas, alcohol/drug or gang related inferences. See through tops, halter tops, mid-driff, tank tops, wide arm-hole tank tops, low cut, or shirts that when arms are raised would bare the abdominal area. Any top exposing undergarments.
- Shorts- Shorts with rips above the mid-thigh or buttocks region, reveal any portion of the buttocks during standing/sitting/bending. Expose any portion of skin/undergarments.
- Pants- Pants with rips above the mid-thigh or buttocks region, reveal any portion of the buttocks during standing/sitting/bending. Pants that reveal any portion of undergarments. Pants that reveal skin above the mid-thigh.
- Leggings/Yoga Pants- Reveal undergarments and/or skin above the mid-thigh. Sheer/See-through tights/leggings/yoga pants worn solely as pants.
- Swim Attire: No Bikinis or thongs, tankini's ok.
- Any apparel, jewelry, cosmetic, chains, make up accessory, or matter of grooming which by virtue of its color arrangement, trademark, or any other attribute denoting membership in a gang or advocating drug use, violence, or clothing bearing racially or sexually offensive messages.

Authorized:

- Shirts- t-shirts, sweaters, hoodies, cover midriff when standing/sitting/bending or arms raised, do not promote un-authorized inferences.
- Shorts- Shorts that fall at the mid-thigh or 6 inches above the knee.
- Pants- Pants that are worn at the waist with no visibility of under garments or skin above the mid-thigh. Are able to be worn with/without a belt at the waist level.
- Leggings/Yoga Pants- Do not reveal skin or undergarments. Must have a shirt/tunic/dress that covers the buttocks portion of the legging/yoga pants.
- Swim Attire-
- Females: One piece & tankini swimsuit. Two piece swimsuits require a shirt to cover.

Camp Policies & Procedures

We are so happy to have you participate in camp! In order to have a fun & safe camp, it is important we set guidelines and rules so all campers, parents, chaperones & staff are on the same page before attending camp. Please read through the guidelines below and participant should initial each item and sign where indicated.

BEHAVIOR

___ Rules will be discussed as a group during the first night of camp. These rules will apply to all campers, teen counselors and adults. Youth are encouraged to come to chaperones, teen counselors or camp directors with any questions or concerns.

___ Campers should NEVER be alone. Camp requires a buddy system. Campers are to always have a “battle buddy” with them wherever they go and an adult should know where they are at all times.

___ Bullying, verbally, physically, and emotionally is NOT TOLERATED at camp by ANYONE.

___ Offensive or inappropriate language or gestures are not permitted. Disrespectful language towards a camper or an adult by a camper or adult are grounds for immediate dismissal.

___ Campers are required to stay in their assigned bunks after lights out. Rooms that do not have a restroom require the camper to let a chaperone know they are going to use the facilities once lights are out. Adults are required to stay in their cabins with their campers to ensure their safety after lights out.

___ Public Displays of Affection (PDA) should not occur between any campers, counselors or chaperones either at camp or on the bus. This includes excessive hugging or holding, holding hands, kissing, etc. This rule applies to camp as well as in route to and from armories on the bus.

___ There should NEVER be an exchange of contact information with between adults and campers or teen counselors whether it be phone numbers, addresses of any type or social networking contact information.

___ Youth choosing to make poor choices may require some time away from the group to reconsider their actions. These youth may be required to sit with the camp medics or other adults until they have had time to regroup. This will be decided on a case by case basis.

ALCOHOL/DRUG/TOBACCO POLICY

___ There is a zero tolerance policy for alcohol, tobacco and drugs at this camp. This includes e-cigarettes and vaping. Any camper or adult who violates this policy will be dismissed from camp.

WEAPONS

___ Weapons such as guns, knives, or other instruments will not be permitted at camp. This includes pocket knives for campers.

ELECTRONICS POLICY *

___ Electronics are no longer allowed at camp. This includes cell phones, iPods, iPads, MP3 players hand-held video games. Any device that is capable of sending and/or receiving an internet signal is strictly forbidden. Devices found by adult chaperones or staff will be turned in to the Camp Directors. Devices will be returned to the parents at the appropriate armory. Digital cameras that DO NOT send or receive an internet signal are authorized. **Adults are NOT to allow campers or teen counselors to use their cell phones, iPads, iPods or any other electronic device for any reason. In fairness, this includes parent/child situations. *Youth needing to call home should notify a Camp Director.**

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

___ All attendees need to be responsible for hand-carrying their luggage to and from the bus to their lodging location. Excessive luggage may pose a struggle for some. Please pack accordingly.

HYGIENE

___ All attendees will be expected to maintain good hygiene while at camp. This includes showering, brushing teeth, combing hair, washing hands, changing clothes, and keeping personal belongings in a neat and orderly fashion, etc. Additionally, adults should remind campers that wet clothes and towels need to be hung to dry to avoid mildew and odor.
